Dear Parish Family,

In ancient pagan Roman mythology, the god Janus was the god of portals, gates and doors. He was usually depicted as having two faces, one on the front and the other on the back of his head. The reason was because he was able to see backward in time and forward, as the god of doors he could see where someone had come from and where they were going. The month of January is named for Janus, the month that begins a new year, looking back on all that has been and forward to all that is still yet to be. As we begin this new year of grace 2017, we are indeed mindful and grateful for all that has been. When we reflect on our own personal lives, and the history of St. Paul Church, the people of this parish can be justly proud of all that you have accomplished and the many ways Christ has been known through your presence, your faith and love. But January is also a time to look forward with eager expectation, not afraid of the unknown (as those without faith might be afraid) but confident in all that God still wishes to do in us and through us. God said to the prophet Jeremiah: *"I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future."*

Rooted in the excitement and new opportunities that a new year presents before us, I would like to announce *three new parish initiatives here at St. Paul*. It is my hope that, after careful consideration and prayer, many members of our parish family will choose to take part in one or all of these (or even one of the existing groups and ministries already present in the parish). The three new things I would like to begin here at St. Paul are:

1. **PARISH BOOK CLUB**: I love to read, and I know many of you do as well. I thought it might be fun to come together monthly and discuss books that we might read on pertinent spiritual topics. The first book I would like us to read together is called *"Silence"* by Shusaku Endo. This novel is a work of historical fiction written in 1966 and tells the story of Jesuit missionaries that labored to bring the faith to Japan. The paperback version of the book can be purchased at your favorite bookstore or online (and we will have a few copies for sale in the Parish Office). I would like to have our first meeting of our new Book Club on Wednesday Evening, February 1 in the parish library when we can discuss Chapters 1 and 2 of the book. I hope those who love to read will join me!
2. **COMMUNICATIONS/MEDIA COMMITTEE**: Many people today, especially the young, are truly gifted when it comes to websites, apps and the internet. I would like to form a committee to help us upgrade our parish website, perhaps develop a parish app, and use social media in a better way to assist in the New Evangelization. Please watch the bulletin in the next few weeks for the date and time of the first meeting!
3. **ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE**: Pope Francis has called the Church (and all people of good will) to a greater care for the environment. I would like to form a group of concerned parishioners who can look at the Pope's encyclical *"Laudato Si"* to discover the pope's thoughts on this topic, to help the parish learn more about how religious faith and our obligations to God's creation intersect, and to be involved concretely in environmental issues on the local or state level. This group will meet for the first time on Monday Evening, February 6 (location TBD). All are invited!

I have other ideas floating around in my head for new initiatives in our parish, but let's start here for now. Stay tuned for other opportunities! There are so many ways faith can impact our world, so many opportunities to grow in the life of the Spirit, so many ways to encounter one another and serve together. Get involved in something! There's so much to choose from!


Stewardship Treasure



Eighth grade students had an amazing trip to WTC in New York City for a presentation about engineering cities of the future.


West Side Story

Welcome to Oremus...the next Bible Study Course offered at St Paul Parish...Beginning the week of Feb 17 we will meet once a week for (8) weeks to be inspired and deepen our prayer life. In the Oremus program there are eight sessions, each of which will be led by Fr Mark Toups (via video) who will guide us through an easy-to-understand teaching on prayer. After each session we will have small group discussions surrounding the truths of what we have heard.

In Oremus you will:

- Become aware of God's Presence in your life
- Discover the simple yet profound steps of Catholic Prayer
- Learn how to respond to God and express yourself in prayer
- Discover how to hear God's voice in Scripture, in your heart and in ordinary moments
- Learn how to overcome frustration, distractions and dryness in prayer
- Set that desolation and consolation are a normal part of everyone's walk with God
- Grow in your relationship with God and those around you

In addition to the weekly discussions, you will be invited to pray using specific Scripture passages in your workbook. There will be a specific Scripture passage for each day of the eight weeks. It will be like making an eight week retreat, a perfect way to enter into the Lenten Season and prepare for the Resurrection of our Lord at Easter.

In her autobiography, St. Therese of Lisieux describes prayer in this way: "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven; it is a cry of recognition and love, embracing both trial and joy". God calls all of us, regardless of our state in life, to grow in holiness; and prayer provides the means to deepen our relationship with the Lord. This course is designed to help guide you step-by-step to draw closer to God and listen for his voice speaking to you. If you are hungry for a "surge of the heart" or have been searching for a way to strengthen your prayer life...this study is for you.
