

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

If we were to ask a group of Catholics today what words come to mind when they hear the word "Lent" most of them would say things like "ashes" or "repentance" or "fasting" or the "Stations of the Cross." If we were to ask a group of Catholics from the early centuries of the Church, they would most likely not mention any of those things. They would probably say the word "baptism." The reason is that, for many centuries, the season of Lent was primarily a 40 day retreat for catechumens as they approached the Sacraments of Christian Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist) which would have been administered all three together at the Easter Vigil, celebrated on the night before Easter Sunday. Over the centuries, as the number of fully initiated Catholics grew, Lent, while it continued as a time of preparation for catechumens, began to take on the characteristics we know today: as a time of renewal and spiritual growth. Generally speaking, the first five weeks of Lent invite each person to discern their own program of renewal, usually through the pious practices recommended by Christ Himself in the gospel we hear on Ash fasting, prayer and almsgiving. Wednesday: Beginning with the Fifth Sunday of Lent (the Sunday before Palm Sunday) the sense of the season begins to change. The old liturgical books called this time of Lent 'Passiontide' since it focused more directly on the death of Christ. But for all of these different nuances inherent in the season of Holy Lent, we know that it is a sacred time to grow in relationship with Christ and with one another.

This weekend as we begin this Lenten Season, we are much blessed to have the *Franciscan Friars of the Renewal* to be with us to lead us in a few days of parish retreat/mission. The Friars began as a community in 1987 here in the Northeast when eight Capuchin friars joined together in this spirit of Franciscan renewal. Cardinal McCarrick, when he was Archbishop of Newark, invited the Friars to open a friary in the city of Newark, an old Dominican monastery no longer in use. Since then, the friars, in addition to their other missions and friaries throughout the United States and other parts of the world, have been a strong presence here in our own Archdiocese. In the city of Newark they

work with the poor and homeless, and at times their novitiate (where young new friars began their training) took place in Newark at Most Blessed Sacrament Friary. During my time as Director of Vocations and Director of Emmaus House of Discernment, I lived a few blocks in Newark from the friars. Several of the men I worked with in Emmaus House were discerning a vocation to the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. Even today, it is a wonderful thing to see so many healthy and 'normal' young men who have joined and are still joining this community. Their life is not an easy one according to the world's standards, but their joy and holiness is an incredible witness. For this reason, I invited them last year to come and lead St. Paul Parish in a Lenten Mission. And finally the time has come!

The Friars will preach at all Masses this weekend here at St. Paul, and they invite all parishioners to join them on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings of this week in church from 7:30 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. each evening. The Friars will lead us in adoration of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, powerful reflections and inspiring music, on Tuesday they will offer the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and on Wednesday they will lead us in a Healing Service. Also on Tuesday they will speak with our **Youth Group**. I've asked all groups and ministries in the parish not to meet during these days so that all parishioners can begin this season of Holy Lent at the Parish Mission. I know that anyone who enters into this sacred time for our parish family in a spirit of generosity and faith will not be disappointed. If it were possible for you to change your family or personal schedule to be present at as much of the Parish Mission as you can, I know God will bless your openness to Him and your desire for a spiritually fruitful Lent for you and your family. This is also a great opportunity for the New Evangelization: if you know anyone who is struggling or who has been away from the practice of their faith, please invite them to the Parish Mission. May God be with us during these days of renewal as we begin the season of renewal, Holy Lent!
