

LENTEN CHILDREN OF HOPE

Sunday, March 5th, our children will gather in the Church at 6:30 p.m. for *a Lenten Children of Hope*, a time of Eucharistic Adoration for children with a Lenten theme. This could be a wonderful Lent prayer experience for our children.

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

In His letter to the Church for *Lent 2017*, our Holy Father Pope Francis wrote: "Lent is a new beginning, a path leading to the certain goal of Easter. Christ's victory over death. This season urgently calls us to conversion. Christians are asked to return to God 'with all their hearts' (Joel 2:12), to refuse to settle for mediocrity and to grow in friendship with the Lord. Jesus is the faithful friend who never abandons us. Even when we sin, He patiently awaits our return; by that patient expectation, He shows us His readiness to forgive...... The Word of God is alive and powerful, capable of converting hearts and leading them back to God. When we close our heart to the gift of God's word, we end up closing our heart to the gift of our brothers and sisters. Dear friends, Lent is the favorable season for renewing our encounter with Christ, living in His word, in the sacraments and in our neighbor."

Often in his writings and speeches Pope Francis speaks of a *Culture of Encounter*. This culture the Church (and each member of the Church) must create, a culture of inclusion that includes a passion for facilitating that encounter between Christ and others. This we call the New Evangelization, called for by Pope St. John Paul II and reinforced through the teachings of Benedict XVI and Francis. Fasting, prayer and almsgiving are a wonderful program for Lenten renewal (as the Church reminds us) but we need to make sure that their effects are not just interior ones. *Fasting* can include more than just food: perhaps we can fast a bit on the time we spend in front of the television or computer screen, the time we spend with our noses buried in our cell phones, the time we spend murmuring and gossiping about others. Instead, perhaps we can spend that extra time in reaching out to others, volunteering to assist a person in need, joining a ministry in the parish, and being more present to those with whom we live and work. If our only reason for fasting is to lose weight so that we can look better in that suit or dress, then we have missed the point! If someone admires our weight loss, we have already received our reward. Fasting as a spiritual discipline designed to make us holier so that our lives can speak to the world of God is what our fasting should be about! *Prayer* is that intimate encounter with God within and around us. While prayer enlarges our own hearts, it does so not solely for our own sakes, but so that we may emerge from our time of prayer changed and renewed in our willingness to encounter others and help to change our world. Almsgiving helps us to recognize what we have and understand that some of what God has given to us is really meant for us to share with others who have less. But are we just giving from what we have left over, or will we give sacrificially to others. Mother Teresa always used to encourage people to 'give until it hurts.' After all, this is the way Christ has given to us.

In his *Lenten Message*, Pope Francis concluded: "May the Holy Spirit lead us on a true journey of conversion, so that we can rediscover the gift of God's word, be purified of the sin that blinds us, and serve Christ present in our brothers and sisters in need. Let us pray for one another so that, by sharing in the victory of Christ, we may open our doors to the weak and the poor. Then we will be able to experience and share to the full the joy of Easter."

While there are many opportunities for spiritual growth available in our parish for Lent, may I highlight our *Friday evening Stations of the Cross*? This traditional Lenten prayer is a powerful way to journey with Christ along the road that led through suffering to salvation. Please come and join us as we join with Him! May Holy Lent be a time of true conversion, deeper faith, all-encompassing love!


