FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

During my years as Director of Vocations for the Archdiocese, I was not assigned to any parish. Although I helped out as a Sunday assistant in a few places, my full-time ministry was working with young men who were discerning a call to priesthood either as Vocations Director or with the men who lived with me in our Emmaus House of Discernment in Newark. Although I truly loved my work, Holy Week was always a difficult time, mostly because I missed parish work during that week especially. I've always loved this time of year not just because of the spiritual realities they celebrate, but also because it is a time when we can really see what it means to be a parish family. It always moves me, especially during the celebration of the *Paschal Triduum*, to see parishioners mobilizing and using their talents to create a beautiful experience of prayer for the parish at large. Those with a flair for art decorate the Church; those with the gift of music rehearse to lead the parish in sung prayer; those who love liturgy practice to proclaim God's Word or serve at the altar; those who like outdoor work give of themselves to make the parish property look beautiful and welcoming. Some send up baked goodies to the rectory, some agree to have their feet washed on Holy Thursday, some plan an exciting Easter Egg hunt for the children. These things (and many others) are truly what parish is about: each person giving of themselves according to their own talents and desires to create something wonderful. Preachers preach, cleaners clean, designers design, prayers pray! And it all comes together in this beautiful crescendo of praise we offer to the God who loves us! As St. Teresa of Calcutta used to say: *"What I can do, you cannot; what you can do, I cannot. But together we can do something beautiful for God."*

I want to thank all of those who participated in any way to make our Lent and Holy Week such an amazing experience here at St. Paul. Those who donated flowers for inside or outside the Church, those who provided our *Easter Candle*, those who helped to build the *New Fire at the Easter Vigil* (and make sure it didn't burn down the house), all was important! Those who were so generous to your parish at Easter, even if the only 'contribution' you could make this year was to show up and be present, it was all important! It was a bit exhausting too, and it was nice to have a few quieter days after Easter, but I know I speak for our priests when we thank each and every one of you for participating in these holiest of days! If you were part of the *Oremus Gatherings*, or came to the rectory at the break of dawn each Monday morning for *Lectio Divina*, or helped with the parish *Fish Fry* (especially those who so lovingly cooked and our *Youth Group* who so generously served), or came to pray the *Stations of the Cross* - each in your own way contributed to a beautiful experience of Lent and Eastertime! I also want to thank our wonderful staff in the name of the entire parish community for all their hard work, especially those who worked with our children, and those who led our *Good Friday Seven Last Words / Tenebrae Service*. I am certain I am missing someone, but please know of my gratitude (and, more importantly, God's) for all you have done.

While we are thinking about thanksgivings, let's keep going: I also want to thank all those who have worked with our *First Communion Children* preparing them for these wonderful Sunday celebrations of First Eucharist: our catechists under the direction of *Colleen Jagde and Lisa Oliviera*, along with the parents and guardians whose are the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith, and the families and friends who came to celebrate. We also want to thank our children who worked so hard to come to know the Jesus who knows and loves them!

Last but certainly not least, I want to thank our *Buildings and Grounds Committee* and *Donna Schifano* and all those who participated in last weekend's *Parish Clean Up Day*. It was so inspiring to see so many here who came to make God's house as beautiful outside as it is inside! It was truly inspiring to see *Fr. Stefano and Fr. Paul* in their jeans raking and cleaning, and to have experienced this great season with them. All of it is a reflection of the beauty of God's family for He dwells also within us individually and together as His Church! May this Easter Season continue to be a time of great joy for us, joy in our relationship with God and joy in the gift of one another. We look forward yet again to all that God has planned in the future! Easter Blessings!




Love Hurts: The Truth Behind Redemptive Suffering - Matthew Leonard (CD)

SACRAMENT PREPARATION

Our Faith Formation journey is one in which we grow in a deeper relationship with the person of Christ and understanding of the Catholic Church. Preparation for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation happen separately from the scheduled Faith Formation Sessions. The young people are enrolled in the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion Preparation sessions once one full year of curriculum has been completed. Children traditionally enroll in the Faith Formation Program in 1st grade and First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion are generally celebrated in 2nd grade. Young people being presented for the Sacrament of Confirmation should have attended continuous Catholic faith formation since First Holy Communion. There will be special Parent Meetings and Family/Child Preparation Sessions for all children who choose to receive the Sacraments. Notifications of Meetings and Preparation Sessions will be mailed to families at the appropriate time. If you have a child that attends Catholic School, you should contact the Faith Formation office at the end of their 1st grade and 8th grade year, in order to obtain the information regarding enrolling in the Sacrament Preparation program. Those that attend the Academy of St. Paul will have information mailed home.

Guidelines will be outlined at a Special Sacrament Preparation Parent meeting.


