



FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty was leader of the Roman Catholic Church in Hungary from 1945 until 1973. Throughout his years as a priest, bishop, and cardinal archbishop, he was unwavering in his dedication to the Catholic faith and in opposition to fascism and communism in his country. He endured torture, imprisonment, and eventually exile, dying in Vienna in 1975. He was a staunch supporter of the Catholic family, and wrote much in support of it. One of his most famous writings I share with you today *on Mother's Day*. Cardinal Mindszenty wrote:

The most important person on earth is a mother.

She cannot claim the honor of having built Notre Dame Cathedral.

She need not.

She has built something more magnificent than any cathedral- a dwelling for an immortal soul, the tiny perfection of her baby's body.

The angels have not been blessed with such a grace.

They cannot share in God's creative miracle to bring new saints to Heaven.

Only a human mother can.

Mothers are closer to God the Creator than any other creature.

God joins forces with mothers in performing this act of creation.

What on God's good earth is more glorious than this: to be a mother?

How wonderful it is for us to take this day and give thanks for our mothers, grandmothers, godmothers, aunts, and spiritual mothers: those who have loved us and prayed for us wherever they are, in heaven or still here with us on earth. In a very real way, the love of a mother is a powerful image of the love of God for each of us. In the name of our parish staff, we want to wish all of our parish mothers a blessed day, and to the spiritual mothers whose vision and faith and spirit of sacrifice helped to build our parish of St. Paul here in Ramsey. We pray for them and give thanks!

This week we also remember a very special mother in each of our lives: the *Mother of God*! One hundred years ago this weekend Our Lady appeared to three poor shepherd children in a cove outside of the village of Fatima, Portugal. She asked the children to return on the 13th of each month for the next five months. During her visitation to the children she called the world back to the love of God through repentance and prayer, most especially the holy rosary. This week two of the children (who died within a few years of the apparitions) will be canonized saints by Pope Francis: Saint Jacinta Marto and Saint Francisco Marto. Their cousin Lucia, the oldest of the three children of Fatima, died several years ago after living many years as a Carmelite nun in Coimbra. Sister Lucia, in later years, said that Our Lady appeared to her before her death in 2005. In a letter to Cardinal Carlo Caffarra, Sister Lucia wrote: "The final battle between the Lord and the kingdom of Satan will be about Marriage and the Family.... But don't be afraid because whoever works for the sanctity of Marriage and the Family will always be fought against and opposed in every way, because this is the decisive issue. Nevertheless, Our Lady has already crushed his head." A small committee in our parish led by Fr. Paul has planned a series of events for this coming year to celebrate the anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima. On this Mother's Day, let us pray for the family, and may Our Lady teach us again how to love one another and her Son with fidelity and joy.





NETFLIX SERIES 13 REASONS WHY

Dear Parents and Guardians.

I am reaching out to all of you with concerned effort to bring awareness to a Netflix series that is gaining popularity. It has been brought to my attention that many of students have viewed the series. encourage you all to read this email and its attached articles in entirety.

Many of you may have heard through the media about the Netflix series 13 Reasons Why based on a book by Jay Asher. The story follows a teenager as he unravels the tragic suicide of his classmate and crush. He receives a box of videos recorded by her and the series unfolds as an emotional audio diary.

This is not something that any child should be viewing alone. It is however something I would encourage parents and educators to watch. It is graphic and there are some very disturbing scenes that without parental supervision could prove very upsetting to impressionable minds. While the creators of the series have "insisted that the series was meant to be helpful-to bring up important conversations" it is important to remember that "suicide is the third leading cause of death among young people between the ages of 10 and 24."
