

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

We hope you like the color green! Now that we have come through Lent and Easter, and have celebrated Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, and Corpus Christi, we now fully enter into the Church's longest liturgical season called Ordinary Time. The liturgical color for this season is green, and we will remain in this season of Ordinary Time until the First Sunday of Advent in late November. Its important for us to remember what the Church means when it speaks of "ordinary" time. We may think of this word as meaning a time when there's nothing special, just ordinary (and perhaps kind of boring or hum-drum). But nothing could be further from the truth! When the Church speaks of Ordinary Time it uses the word in the sense of "ordinal" time, meaning ordered or counted time. For this reason the Sundays of Ordinary Time are assigned a number: this weekend we celebrate the *Twelfth Sunday of Ordinary Time*. While the other liturgical seasons highlight one aspect of Christ's life (e.g. Advent leads us to reflect on Christ's Second Coming and Christmas calls us to contemplation of Christ's birth in Bethlehem; Lent reminds us of our need for repentance through our proclamation of the stories of Christ's temptations and Easter presents us with the stories surrounding Christ's Resurrection) in the liturgical season of Ordinary Time we encounter Christ's life in its fullness. This season is not the absence of a theme or a focus, it very beautifully helps us to focus on the totality that is Christ and His meaning in our own lives. We begin Ordinary Time in summer and, like its liturgical counterpart, we may view summertime as a time less focused (especially for those whose work and school obligations lessen in summer). But nothing could be further from the truth! Summertime is a time to catch up on the things we sometimes cannot do during the year: time resting, reading, enjoying outdoors, spending time with people we love and enjoy. Summertime brings with it a "holy obligation" to give our bodies and minds some needed rest, perhaps even a vacation in some beautiful place that touches our hearts with special people in our lives. I hope that your summertime plans are beginning to take shape in your thoughts and planning! When you go away, be sure to look for God in the destinations and people you will visit. And, of course, be sure to find a place to celebrate Holy Mass on Sunday. And, if you see any good ideas in the bulletins of the churches you will visit, let us know. We are not above stealing good ideas from good people!

This coming week we will welcome a new staff person to our parish: *Craig Jandoli* will take over as our new part-time *Youth Minister*. I met Craig and his family when I was a younger parochial vicar at St. Thomas the Apostle Church in Bloomfield and Craig was a first grader there. In the years that followed, I've watched Craig grow into one of the most "on-fire" Christians I have ever met. I had the opportunity to watch Craig graduate Paramus Catholic High School (where he met Fr. Paul), go into the seminary for a while, discern a call to marriage, marry his wonderful wife Brittany, and become father to two beautiful sons, Devin and Connor. Craig currently resides with his family in Hawthorne and is Vice Principal of Hawthorne High School. For six years, Craig was our youth minister at St. Thomas More Church in Fairfield, and while there I watched him form young Catholics through his example and his love of Christ in the scriptures, the Blessed Sacrament, and in the Church. We are most grateful to have Craig become a part of our parish family here at St. Paul. I am hoping that some Sunday soon he will speak at all the Masses to introduce himself. *Please keep Craig's ministry (and our youth) in your prayers as we do our best to build on this parish tradition of a great youth ministry!*

F. Scott Fitzgerald wrote in "The Great Gatsby": "And so with the sunshine and the great bursts of leaves growing on the trees, just as things grow in fast movies, I had that familiar conviction that life was beginning over again with the summer." And so it is! When we have faith, each season, each day is an opportunity for new life. Enjoy the summer!

CELEBRATE THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA



As the June (13th) 1917 apparition of Our Lady of Fatima ended, the seers saw the heart of Our Lady surrounded with piercing thorns, which represented the offenses committed against her – and were the sins that needed reparation through the 'First Saturday devotion'. To fulfill the First Saturday devotion,

Mary asked the faithful to:

- "confess their sins,
- receive Holy Communion,
- recite 5 decades of the Rosary,
- and keep me company for 15 minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary,
- with the intention of making reparation to me."

Mary promised that she will assist at the moment of death with all graces necessary for salvation to all who make this devotion. Jesus subsequently appeared to Sr. Lucia, encouraging this devotion to be made not once, but over and over again – and asked her to spread this devotion, explaining there are five kinds of offenses and blasphemies spoken against the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- Against her Immaculate Conception
- Against her perpetual virginity
- Against her Divine maternity & refusing to accept her as the Mother of mankind
- By those who try publicly to implant in the hearts of children an indifference, contempt and even hate for this Immaculate Mother
- For those who insult her directly in her sacred images


