FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Several days ago my last living uncle passed away at the age of 96. To experience the death of a family member is always difficult, but in this case there was a sense of relief and even joy for him. He had been suffering for the past few years and spoke to me often about his desire to go to heaven, and I know he meant it. Far from a perfect person, he always impressed me as someone with a great commitment to Sunday Mass. Even when other members of our family did not go to Mass every Sunday, he always did. He told me once that when he was a young man serving in the United States Army during World War II, he was assigned to a military base as a policeman in Australia, New Zealand, and the Philippines. There he contracted malaria, a disease that re-emerged periodically throughout his life. He said that the thing that got him through this tough experience was Sunday Mass. I remember him telling me often that, when homesick and sad during those years, he would look forward to Sunday Mass in the local church because he knew his family in Paterson, NJ were also at Mass, hearing the same Scripture readings, and listening to the same prayers (in these years, the Mass was in Latin). Mass every Sunday was the only place he felt at home, and throughout the rest of his life the celebration of Holy Mass on Sunday attracted him. I pray that the Heavenly Liturgy is his comfort now more than ever. And I am grateful always for his reflection on the importance of Holy Mass and the beauty of the universal Roman Catholic Church, now over 1 billion souls worldwide that pray together each Sunday in all of the altars of the world, listening to the same Scriptures, receiving the same Lord in the Eucharist. Remember, even when away on vacation, find a Church and be sure to give God some of your time on His day, Sunday, the day of resurrection and new life. After all, God doesn't ever take a vacation from loving you or listening to your prayers - may we also put Him first no matter where we are!

This weekend we find ourselves near the middle of summertime, still some wonderful opportunities for vacation. I remember several years ago during the pontificate of Pope Benedict XVI the Holy Father Emeritus spoke about the importance of summer rest and gave some suggestions for a spiritually profitable vacation. First of all, he invited all those who can to use vacation time as a way to renew relationships with people we love and with God. Interrupting the hectic and frantic pace of daily life, we can take time to dedicate ourselves to others and to God. The Pope even suggested we include a copy of Sacred Scripture in our suitcase. He also invited us to contemplate the greatness, and admire the beauty of creation around us, recognizing in it the wonderful presence of the Creator. We need to observe this magnificent gift, he said, with the same attention Jesus did. Jesus knew how to interpret the language and signs of creation, which is a gift we must respect, protect and care for, in the name of God, humanity and future generations. Finally, Pope Benedict suggested that vacationers become curious to discover the monuments of faith and culture in the places they visit. For example, visiting a cathedral or a parish church for a moment of prayer (and, of course, Sunday Mass), or spending some time in a museum or place of historic importance can help us enrich our own lives while developing and cultivating a deeper appreciation of art, history, and faith. The enjoyment of friendship, reading, nature and culture helps to nourish and restore our spirit. It gives us the strength to continue our journey refreshed and renewed. So, if you haven't gone on vacation yet (I haven't!) do your best to enjoy some time away. And, like my uncle, if you feel a bit nostalgic for home, try going to Holy Mass, and you will feel once again the joy of home in your Father's House wherever it exists!

The 20/20 project is starting point to attaining equal rights for babies in the womb. The first goal is to pass the Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act in New Jersey by the year 2020 (bill numbers are A-3452 and S2026). This legislation, which has already been passed in 14 other states, would protect babies from late-term abortion (20 weeks-or 5 months-post-fertilization and beyond).

CELEBRATE THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA



Our Lady of Fatima showed the visionaries her heart surrounded with piercing thorns, which represented the offenses committed against her – and were the sins that needed reparation through the 'First Saturday devotion'. To fulfill the First Saturday devotion, Mary asked the faithful to:

- "confess their sins,
- receive Holy Communion,
- recite 5 decades of the Rosary,
- and keep me company for 15 minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary,
- with the intention of making reparation to me "

Mary promised that she will assist at the moment of death with all graces necessary for salvation to all who make this devotion. Jesus subsequently appeared to Sr. Lucia, encouraging this devotion to be made not once, but over and over again – and asked her to spread this devotion, explaining there are five kinds of offenses and blasphemies spoken against the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- Against her Immaculate Conception
- Against her perpetual virginity
- Against her Divine maternity & refusing to accept her as the Mother of mankind
- By those who try publicly to implant in the hearts of children an indifference, contempt and even hate for this Immaculate Mother
- For those who insult her directly in her sacred images

THE SOCIETY OF AFRICAN MISSIONS APPEAL ~ AUGUST 12 AND 13

Rev. Charles Boyce, a priest of the Archdiocese of Monrovia, Liberia and the S.M.A. Fathers, will make an appeal to the parish to assist the Society of African Missions the weekend of August 12 and 13. Father Charles is the rector of St. Charles Lwanga Pre-major Seminary in Monrovia. He was ordained on August 15, 1990 and has served St. Charles Lwanga Pre-major Seminary in many capacities.

Liberia is a small country on the west coast of Africa, established as a home to resettle "Free Slaves" from the United States of America through a philanthropic organization known as the American Colonization Society (ACS). Between 1816 to 1840, hundreds of "Free Slaves" were sent to Liberia from the port of Baltimore, Maryland and other parts of the USA to start a new life in Africa. On July 26, 1847 Liberia was declared a republic and her capital city, Monrovia, was named after President James Monroe of the USA because of his valuable role in the establishment of the country. Together with the native people of Liberia, the "Free Slaves" from the USA or the "Americo-Liberians", make up an estimated population of about 4.5 million.

S.M.A. stands for the society's name in Latin: Societas Missionum ad Afros, a worldwide organization of Catholic missionaries serving in nearly every country of Africa and serving people of African descent wherever they are.

In 1906 the SMA Missionaries established the Catholic Faith in Liberia through evangelism, education, health care and social services for the people. The SMA Missionaries have trained and established the local church. There are three dioceses in Liberia (Monrovia, Cape Palmas and Gbarnga).

The SMA Missionaries and the local church in Liberia have played a significant role in the social educational, religious, and political development of the country. Three years ago, they were instrumental in the prevention and fight against an Ebola outbreak, a deadly virus that killed about three thousand people in the country. They are actively involved in dialogue and collaboration with the Islamic faith and other Christian churches in the country as well as the development of programs for women, human rights environmental protection issues.
