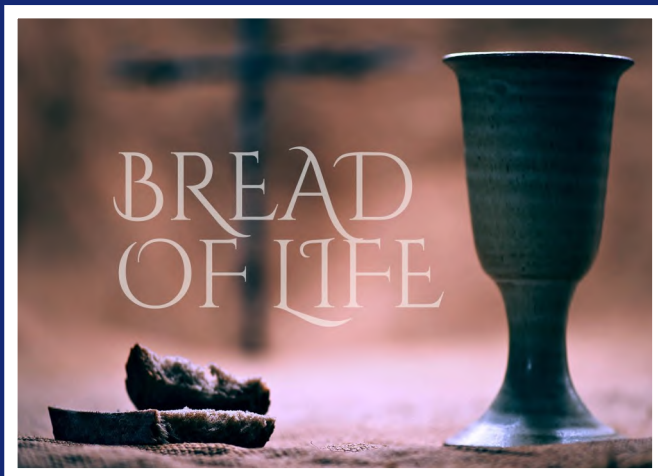

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Personally speaking, one of the most profound experiences for me during my time as pastor of St. Paul Church has been our **parish pilgrimage to the Holy Land** last November. A trip to the Holy Land is a life changing experience- not necessary for holiness or a deep understanding of the Sacred Scriptures (because the Christ who walked the streets of the Holy Land is the same Christ present to us during Holy Mass and in our own prayer lives), but certainly a tremendous grace and opportunity to grow in love for the Bible. To visit these sacred destinations, and to do it with members of your own parish family as a pilgrimage of prayer, has a tremendous impact on our lives and the life of our parish. Old friendships deepen, new friendships form, and I've always enjoyed getting to know parishioners in a different setting and experiencing something truly special with them. So many of those who traveled with us to the Holy Land told me that their experience of Christmas and Easter this past year was so enriched by the fact that when they heard the stories of Christ's Birth, Passion, Death and Resurrection proclaimed in Church it was so powerful for them because they could actually envision those places of which the Scriptures spoke.

Well, we are at it again! There are so many possible destinations we could visit as we seek to experience more of our faith, but it occurred to me that an important thing for us to do would be to walk "**In the Footsteps of St. Paul.**" Our Patron Saint was so instrumental in the spread of the Gospel even beyond the confines of the Holy Land. So it seemed logical that our next parish pilgrimage should be to Greece so that we can visit some of those sacred places immortalized forever and made sacred by St. Paul during his missionary journey's. With that goal in mind, we've planned a **Great Experience tour through Greece** which will leave Ramsey during **Lent of next year** (our departure date is set for **March 26, 2019**). Our pilgrimage will begin with a flight from Newark Liberty Airport to **Thessaloniki, Greece**. It was to the Christians of this town that St. Paul wrote his first epistle (the letter of **St. Paul to the Thessalonians** was written about 51 A.D., within twenty years of the Resurrection of Christ). From Thessaloniki we will travel to Philippi (recipients of **St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians**). There we will visit the site of the conversion of Lydia

(read this wonderful story in the 16th chapter of Acts of the Apostles- coincidentally, her feast day was celebrated a few days ago- August 3 is the feast of St. Lydia Purpuraria, Lydia of the Purple). After a few days in this part of northern Greece, we will take a short flight to **Athens**. There we will visit sites of religious, cultural, archaeological and historical importance. Of special note will be our visit to the **Areopagus**, the "Hill of Ares" where St. Paul went to preach about Christ to the powerful court of Athenians who met there (read Acts 17). During my last visit to Athens twenty years ago, it struck me that this Areopagus literally in the shadow of the great **Temple of Athena Parthenos** (as we call it today, the "Parthenon", the temple of the pagan Greek goddess of wisdom Athena after which the city is named). After a few more days in Athens, we will board a cruise ship for a cruise of the Greek Isles. Part of our cruise will take us into Turkey to visit the town of Kusadasi (known during the time of St. Paul as Ephesus and to whom he wrote his **Letter to the Ephesians**). There in Ephesus we will **celebrate Holy Mass at the house of the Blessed Virgin Mary** where tradition tells us Our Lady lived with St. John in the years after Christ's Resurrection. Other destinations during our Greek cruise will be **Rhodes, Crete**, and the famous islands of **Santorini and Mykonos** (which have no special religious significance but are beautiful seaside destinations). Finally, we will end our cruise with a visit to the **island of Patmos** and visit the cave where St. John wrote the **Book of Revelation**.

We are planning a special information evening for this pilgrimage on **Wednesday evening September 12th in our Academy library** when **Anne Breslin (one of our parishioners and the owner of Great Experiences Travel here in Ramsey)** will speak about the details of our parish pilgrimage. Brochures with more information on this trip are available now in the parish office or by calling Great Experiences. We expect this trip to fill up quickly, and the number of people we can take is limited- remember our Holy Land trip filled up in three days and we had to turn away 12 people because there was no more room. I invite you to consider, along with your family and friends, to come and travel with us, the family of St. Paul, "**In the Footsteps of St. Paul**" next Lent. **Hope you are enjoying summer.**

Abstain from any particular food or beverage

Fast (one full meal and two smaller meals which do not equal one full meal)

Offer up the day's inconveniences

Give up some form of entertainment for the day

Give up anything else of your choice

Offer a work of charity

Learn:

Roe and Doe legalized abortion through all nine months of pregnancy.

Many people don't realize that Roe v. Wade legalized abortion through all nine months of pregnancy. Roe says abortions may not be restricted at all during the first three months and in the second three months may be regulated only for the mother's health. After "viability" Roe allows abortion to be prohibited but must make an exception for the woman's life or health.

But in Roe's companion case, Doe v. Bolton, the Court defined "health" to include "all factors—physical, emotional, psychological, familial, and the woman's age—relevant to the well-being" of the mother. In most states, that is broad enough to permit virtually any abortion in the seventh, eighth, or ninth months of pregnancy if any of these reasons is invoked.

If Roe is overturned, the democratic process in each state—not the courts—will determine abortion policy.

In the state of New Jersey there are no limitations on abortion. The **Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act**, if passed in NJ, would **protect innocent babies from enduring the pain of late-term abortion** (20 weeks – or 5 months – post fertilization and beyond). 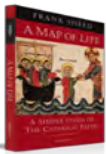
