FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

As you read this bulletin, fifty members of our parish family are on their way to Israel to take part in our parish pilgrimage to the Holy Land. As I wrote to them in the pilgrimage journal: *"In one sense, a pilgrimage to the Holy Land is not necessary to know Christ. The Son of God who once walked these streets now walks your street, who once dwelt in this land now dwells fully in your heart, who lay hidden in a manger now lies hidden in the tabernacle of your church, who once offered Himself on the cross now offers Himself on the altar of every Catholic Church throughout the world during Holy Mass. Many saints have reached great heights of holiness and intimacy with Christ and never had the opportunity to visit the Holy Land."* For this reason we know that this pilgrimage can be an occasion of grace for all of our parish family, not just those who are participating. We invite you to join with us in prayer along the way as you will be very much in our prayers. We also invite you to follow along with us on Facebook. There you will be able to see some of the photos of our trip along with some of the reflections of the pilgrims. We hope to update it daily, so keep checking back. Above all else, remember that Ramsey is also a Holy Land, because Christ is here, His Kingdom is here, and when we love one another in His name He is present in the most powerful of ways!

I wanted to say a word of thanks to all those who took part in the many retreat graces experienced by members of our parish family last weekend: some of our women participated in *Cursillo*, a Spanish word which means *"a short course in Christianity."* This Archdiocesan retreat program began in Spain and has been helping men and women to learn more about Christ and deepen their relationship to Him in the Church for many decades. I am thrilled to know that St. Paul Church participates in this program, and hope many more of us will take part in the future. Coincidentally, while the women were attending *Cursillo*, men from the parish spent the weekend on our *"Come to the Water" retreat in Mystic, Connecticut*. I had the privilege of being with them and preaching this weekend for them, and it was a very special time of grace in a very beautiful setting. Enders Island, the site of the retreat center, is a small island surrounded by Long Island Sound. There we had the opportunity to contemplate Christ in the beauty of the seasons. Thanks to John Nunziata who put the weekend together!

I also wanted to say thanks to God for the wonderful presence of some of the seminarians from *Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall* who were with us last weekend along with some of their faculty members. These young men have given all to follow Christ, hopefully into the priesthood as they offer Him their lives in service to the Church. Let us continue to pray for them, and especially to pray for the young people of this parish. How blessed we would be to have a young man or woman from St. Paul hear the Lord's call to priesthood or religious life and not be afraid to say yes!

Lastly, I want to say a word of congratulations to our young people who received the *Sacrament of Confirmation* this weekend through the imposition of hands by Bishop Flesey. It is a Sacrament of great power, and we look forward to all that these young people will do for Christ in their lives as they access the Holy Spirit within them. Special thanks to their parents and guardians, and also to our Faith Formation staff and volunteers who prepared them for this important moment in their lives. We look forward to our return to St. Paul Church on November 13th- please pray for us and we will see you soon!


Although we will report all allegations of abuse immediately to the appropriate County Prosecutor, we encourage anyone with an allegation of abuse also to reach out to the prosecutor.


