FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

One of the many ways in which the town of Ramsey is blessed: we have many Catholic priests living in town! Not only do we have four priests here in our own rectory, but we also have religious priests nearby. Because of this, and because there seems to be a genuine pastoral need or at least a desire, **WE'VE DECIDED TO BEGIN CELEBRATING A MASS EVERY SUNDAY EVENING HERE AT ST. PAUL.** So many of you have told me that you often go to other parishes on Sunday evenings for Holy Mass, and that always makes me feel sad because we like to see our family on Sunday, our family day! The other parishes in the area who have Sunday eve Masses seem to offer them around 5 or 6 p.m. So we've decided to offer ours at 7 p.m. each Sunday. We will make a commitment to this Mass every Sunday for one year, the calendar year 2018, and then at the end of this year we can evaluate the Mass to see if people really come. We will of course need a full complement of ministries at this Mass, so if you are willing to serve in any capacity (Lector, Extraordinary Minister, Usher, Altar Server, Music) please let us know as soon as possible. If we are going to offer this option for Holy Mass we want it to be a beautifully planned and prayed Mass in every way possible. For this to happen as it should, we need volunteers! Please spread the word, and we hope this helps all of us to recommit ourselves to the celebration of Sunday Mass without obstacles or excuses. **The Sunday Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life"** as Vatican Council II put it so beautifully. Without Sunday Eucharist it becomes impossible for us to live the lives Christ hopes for us as His people. It is our hope that this expanded Mass schedule helps to facilitate that encounter between Christ and each soul, captivated by His Word and nourished with His Body and Blood! This is the reality that transforms not only our entire week but our entire destiny!

Next Sunday is the *Third Sunday of Advent*, known as *Gaudate Sunday* (from the Latin translation of the antiphon for Holy Mass in the words of St. Paul: "Rejoice, the Lord is near!" and the day we light the pink candle on the Advent wreath). Here at St. Paul we also celebrate *Bambinelli Sunday!* We follow the tradition of the Diocese of Rome, when all the families of Rome bring the Christ Child figures from their home Nativity sets to Church for a special blessing from the Pope. We invite all families to bring their "*Bambinelli*" (their Christ child figures) to Church for a special blessing at all Masses next weekend. Then, we invite all parishioners to join us at 5:00 p.m. for our *Parish Christmas Concert* hosted by our own Music Ministry under the direction of Kristen Dabaghian, to be followed by an outdoor *Christmas Carol Sing* as we light our parish Christmas Tree in front of the Church. Then, all are invited into the rectory for a cup of *Hot Chocolate* and cookies! In this hectic season, we hope many of you will come to share in this beautiful afternoon of song and celebration as we Rejoice together!

I want to once again thank all those who have participated in making our Advent journey such a great one so far: special thanks to all those who worked so hard to make last Sunday's *Advent Wreath Making Breakfast with Santa* such a smashing success, and thanks also to those who came from our parish *CYO Basketball* family for a special blessing at the 9 a.m. Mass (we are most grateful to Joe Lynch and all of the adults that volunteer to work with our children in the basketball program). Special shout out to the *Family Mass Committee*, those who contributed to the *Parish Giving Tree and our food drives*, and those getting up extra early on Monday morning's for *Lectio Divina*. This is the best part of parish life together, when each finds the place to which God is calling them and gifts the parish with the gift of their presence. When we are present to one another, God is present to us! We still have a few weeks left in Advent with more to celebrate. We hope to see you!
