

#### All Hallow's Eve

The name Halloween comes from an older name for October 31st,


All Hallow's Eve. All Hallow's Eve was celebrated on the vigil (night before) All Saints Day (November 1st) and All Souls Day (November 2nd).

Because these two days celebrate those who have died and are in Heaven and purgatory, people would remember the dead with special traditions.

• Trick-or-Treating- Visiting neighborhood homes asking for candy started as a way to pray for the dead. Beggars would go door to door and promise to pray for the deceased members of a family in exchange for some food or a treat.

 Costumes- Traditionally, people would dress up in costumes on All Hallow's Eve, usually like ghosts or demons, to make fun of evil because they knew that Christ had won the battle over sin and death.

 Decorations— It became a tradition to decorate with skulls and other symbols of death to remind us that we will die and must rely on Christ for our salvation.

There are many legends surrounding the beginnings of the Jack-O-Lantern, but one thing that it represents is how much God loves you. He can take us, carve out all the yucky goop (like our mistakes, failures, and sins), put the light of Christ inside of us, and help us shine out for all to see. #### Relics

Relics are a part of the body of a Saint, or sometimes an object that they owned or touched. These relics remind us of the holiness of the person and their closeness with God. Every altar in a church contains relics. Many miracles worked by God through relics were recorded in the Bible and continue to occur today.


There are three classes of relics:

- Ist Class- items from Christ's life (like the True Cross) or part of the remains of a Saint (like a bone)
- 2nd Class- items worn or frequently used by a Saint
- 3rd Class- any items touched to a 1st or 2nd class relic

### St. Michael the Archangel


Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou.

- When we are in Heaven, we are called the Church Triumphant
  - Everyone here is a saint, because they are in the presence of God
- In Purgatory, we are called the Church Expectant
  - o These souls will one day be saints after being purified
- Here on earth, we are called the Church Militant
  - We have souls and hope to one day be a saint

We celebrate All Saint's Day on November 1st, and All Soul's Day on November 2nd.

What is the difference?

We believe that as a Church we can work together for the good of the Kingdom. The saints in Heaven can pray for us. and we can pray for the souls in purgatory.

"In the communion of saints. 'a perennial [ongoing] link of charity exists between the faithful who have already reached their heavenly home, those who are expiating their sins in purgatory and those who are still pilgrims on earth. Between them there is, too, an abundant exchange of all good things:"

# Praying for the Dead

It is important to remember to pray for those who have died. The R.I.P. on tombstones stands for "Rest in Peace." which comes from this prayer. You can pray this when you hear about someone who has died or when you pass a cemetery.

Eternal rest grant unto them. O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God. Rest In Peace. Amen



Are zombies real? Have you ever been afraid of stories about zombies? Zombies are not real. but we do believe "in the resurrection of the dead" (The Nicene Creed). It is important to remember that when Jesus comes again. both our souls and our bodies will be with Him forever in Heaven. Want to read real stories about the dead rising? Check out Lazarus coming back to life in John II. or the raising of some saints at the Resurrection of Jesus in Matthew 27:52, or the final resurrection in John 5:25–29, I Corinthians I5:12, and Philippians 3:II.
